



# West Ottawa Soccer Club Outdoor Adult Open Rec League Rules

May 23, 2018

## **SHORT-HANDED RULE**

If one team does not have enough players and is short-handed, the opposing team must play with only one player more on the field.

**It is recommended that teams share players if one team is short-handed.**

1. Eligibility:  
All players must be registered with the West Ottawa Soccer Club for the current summer season.
2. Game Sheets:  
All players must be listed on the game sheet.  
Both the Home & Away Team must provide two game sheets to the Referee before the game. The Referee will return one completed game sheet to each team at the end of each game.
3. Call-Ups:  
Teams can call up players until they have 18 players for the game.  
Teams can borrow players from other Adult Open Rec teams which do not have a game that night.  
If a team is using a Call-Up player, that player must be marked on the game sheet and clearly marked as a call-up.
4. Team/Spectator Location:  
Both team benches are to be on the same side of the field as chosen by the home coach. Team benches shall be set up at least 5 yards away from the centre line and coaches are to remain on their own half of the field during the game.  
All spectators are to observe the match from the opposite side of the field from the team benches. Additionally, spectators are not permitted anywhere along the goal line.
5. Where Assistant Referees are not provided by the club, the Home Team shall provide one volunteer to assist the referee on the player side of the field. The Away Team shall provide one volunteer to assist the referee on the spectator side of the field.
6. Substitutions:  
Teams may substitute their players on any Goals, Goal Kicks or due to injury. Additionally, teams may substitute on their own Throw-Ins after which the opposing team may also substitute their players.
7. League Standings:  
3 points are awarded for a win, 1 point for a tie and 0 points for a loss.  
Points Tie Breaker - Goal Differential (Plus/Minus), Most Goals For, Fewest Goals Against & Shutouts.  
If there is still a tie for first place, the Division winner will be determined by the teams Seasonal Discipline Record. If still tied, results between the tied teams are used to calculate Points, Goal Differential (Goals For minus Goals Against) & Shutouts.
8. Failure To Show, Abandoned and Forfeited games:
  - a) A team shall be allowed a 15-minute grace period from the scheduled kick-off time. As soon as 7 players are available, the game shall commence.

If there are fewer than 7 players, the opposing team will be awarded a win by a score of 2-0.  
If both teams have fewer than 7 players, the game will be scored a 0-0 tie.

- b) Only the referee can abandon a game due to severe weather or other unusual conditions. Always go to the field for your scheduled games.
- c) Games abandoned before the completion of three-quarters (3/4) of the total regular playing time shall be rescheduled. Games abandoned in the last 1/4 of the game will be considered complete and the score at that time will be considered the final game score.
- d) Games cancelled due to a High Humidex reading, or that are abandoned due to inclement weather will be re-scheduled where possible taking into consideration the remaining time before the end of the season. Any games which are not played will be scored a 0-0 tie.
- e) If a team forfeits a game for any reason, the opponents will be awarded a win by a score of 2-0.

9. Discipline:

WOSC follows the Ontario Soccer Association (OSA) Discipline by Review (DBR) System.

Players found guilty of Red Card offences will be ineligible as per OSA regulations with the following exception:

- Dismissed for “Denying an obvious goal scoring opportunity to an opponent moving towards the opponent’s goal by an offence punishable by a free kick or penalty kick.” (=> 1 game suspension).

Verbal or physical assault against a Referee, Team Official and/or Player will result in the immediate ejection from the field and surrounding area.

Infractions against Referees will result in immediate suspension from the league and will be dealt with in accordance with the OSA Discipline Policies and Procedures.

All incidents will be reported to the Eastern Ontario District Soccer Association (EODSA).

10. All Referee decisions are final.

11. All other game rules will follow the FIFA Laws of the Game.
